ABOUT THE EXHIBIT: Photographer Nick Garcia tells the story of Malala Yousafzai's 2017 visit to Nigeria through a series of photos that include scenes from Maiduguri, birthplace of the Boko Haram, whose name means "no Western education"; and a village in Zaria, where girls are learning to advocate for their education. With more than 130 million girls out of school, the project showcases the important work of Malala Fund to support local activists working to break down barriers to girls' education.

The photography exhibition, presented by Citi, is accompanied by a film about Malala Fund and the locally-led girls' education initiative in Nigeria. Both will be on display in the historic White-Meyer House for two weeks. Members of the public are encouraged to visit and view the photographs to learn more about the work of Malala Fund.
