

## HER EXCELLENCY ROSEMARY BANKS

**Ambassador of New Zealand** 

Ambassador Banks has had a 40 year career in the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade (MFAT), including six overseas assignments. She was Permanent Representative to the United Nations in New York, Ambassador to France and Portugal, and New Zealand's Permanent Representative to the OECD. Ambassador

Banks also served as Deputy Chief of Mission in Honiara and Canberra. As Deputy Secretary in New Zealand's MFAT, Ambassador Banks was responsible for multilateral, legal and consular affairs. She coordinated the emergency responses to the 9/11 terrorist attacks, the Bali bombings and the Asian tsunami. Drawing on these experiences, she led the development of a new emergency response system and guidance manual. Earlier Wellington-based positions included Director of Development Assistance, Director of North Asia Division, Director of Public Affairs and foreign policy adviser to the Minister. Ambassador Banks has a Master of Arts degree in Russian with First Class Honors from Canterbury University and a Master of Science from London School of Economics. She has recently served as a Crown negotiator for the Treaty of Waitangi settlement process as a member of the Council of the University of Canterbury, and a Senior Adjunct Fellow in the Department of Political Science.



### **TERESA BARGER**

Teresa Barger spent 21 years at the International Finance Corporation investing in emerging markets companies in nearly all regions of the world. At IFC, among other positions, she was Division Manager for Africa, Deputy Director of Credit/Investment Review, and Director of Private Equity and Investment Funds. In that post she created the first index for EM private equity and co-founded the Emerging Markets Private Equity Association (EMPEA). Barger also developed the first two cor-

porate governance funds in the Emerging Markets for Korea and Brazil. She was subsequently Director of Corporate Governance and Securities Market Development. In this position she was responsible for the governance aspects of IFC investments and using governance as a value addition strategy. She also created the innovative Gemloc bond fund, index, and market development program for local currency bonds. Before joining IFC, Barger was with McKinsey & Company. She is a member of the Council on Foreign Relations and serves on the boards of American University in Cairo, the Casey Health Foundation and ANERA. She also serves on the Advisory Councils for Princeville Global and Lumia Capital. Barger received her AB magna cum laude from Harvard College and her MBA from the Yale School of Management. She did post-graduate work at the American University in Cairo. She speaks Arabic and French.

Edward A. Burrier serves as Chief Operating Officer of the Overseas Private Investment Corporation (OPIC). Beginning in July 2017, he served as OPIC's Vice President of External Affairs. as oversaw all communications, public outreach, and engagement strategies in support of OPIC's mission to support development and advance U.S. foreign policy. As Vice President of External Affairs, he directed the agency's strategy in the successful passage of the BUILD Act. Burrier has over two decades of foreign policy experience, including 18 years on Capitol Hill. He served for four and a half years as Deputy Staff Director of the House Foreign Affairs Committee. During his tenure, the Committee enacted more than 40 pieces of legislation to advance U.S. interests across Africa, Asia, Latin America, and the Middle East. After receiving his B.A. in Political Science from Mary Washington College, Burrier received his M.A. in National Security and Strategic Studies from the U.S. Naval War College. Ambassador Emily Margarethe Haber has been German Ambassador to the United States since June 2018. Immediately prior to this, Ambassador Haber, a career foreign service officer, was deployed to the Federal Ministry of the Interior, serving as State Secretary overseeing security and migration at the height of

the refugee crisis in Europe. In this capacity, she worked closely with the U.S. administration on topics ranging from the fight against international terrorism to global cyberattacks and cybersecurity. In 2009, she was appointed Political Director and, in 2011, State Secretary at the Foreign Office, the first woman to hold either post. Earlier in her career, she served at the German Embassy in Ankara; in Berlin, she has served as Deputy Head of the Cabinet and Parliamentary Liaison Division, as Director of the Organizing for Security and Co-operation in Europe Division, and as Deputy Director-General for the Western Balkans. Ambassador Haber has extensive knowledge of the Soviet Union and Russia, having worked both in the Soviet Union Division at the German Foreign Office and, on various occasions, at the German Embassy in Moscow, where she served as Head of the Economic Affairs Section and Head of the Political Affairs Department. Ambassador Haber attended schools in New Delhi, Bonn, Paris, Brussels, Washington, and Athens. From 1975 to 1980, she studied history and ethnology in Cologne, earning her PhD with a dissertation on German foreign policy during the Morocco crisis on the eve of World War I. Ambassador Haber is married to Hansjörg Haber. The couple has two sons.

Prior to serving at the United Nations, Holliday was Coordinator (Assistant Secretary) of the U.S. State Department's Bureau of International Information Programs and Principal Deputy Assistant Secretary for Public Affairs. From 2000 to 2001, he was Special Assistant to the President and Associate Director of Presidential Personnel at the White House. Following the attacks of September 11, Holliday was tasked by the President's Chief of Staff to work with government agencies to staff the first Office of Homeland Security. From 1998 to 2000, he served as Assistant (deputy) Policy Director to then Governor of Texas. He has also served as the Director of the International Practice at QGA, Executive Director of the Dallas Council on World Affairs and Regional Director for North Africa, the Middle East and Turkey at the International Republican Institute. Holliday served on active and reserve duty as an Officer in the United States Navy from 1988 until 1995 and was recalled to active duty for Operation Desert Storm. He is a recipient of the Joint Service Commendation Medal. He obtained his B.S.F.S. from Georgetown University and his M.A. from the London School of Economics and Political Science. Holliday is a life member of the Council on Foreign Relations, a co-founder of No Labels, and is now serving on the No Labels Advisory Board. He also serves as a Trustee of the Center for the Study of Presidency and Congress, has served as a chapter chair of the Young Presidents Organization (YPO), on the Boards of the Council of American Ambassadors and The International Foundation for Election Systems.

U.S. Senator Joe Manchin (D-W.Va.) was sworn into the United States Senate on November 15, 2010 to fill the seat left vacant by the late Senator Robert C. Byrd. Senator Manchin currently serves as the ranking member of the Senate Energy and Natural Resources Committee, and also serves on the Senate Commit-

tee on Appropriations, the Senate Committee on Armed Services, and the Senate Committee on Veterans' Affairs. Senator Manchin has served in several leadership capacities on various associations, including: Chairman of the National Governors Association, Chairman of the Southern States Energy Board, President of the Council of State Governments, Chairman of the Democratic Governors Association and Chairman of the Southern Governors' Association. Before he began his tenure as West Virginia's 34th governor in January 2005, Senator Manchin served as Secretary of State for West Virginia from 2000 to 2004 and worked as a state legislator from 1982 to 1996. Senator Manchin was born and raised in the small coal mining town of Farmington, W.Va. and attended West Virginia University on a football scholarship.
